Thomas Goss Cabernet Sauvignon

Origin: McLaren Vale, Australia

Lively and open in texture, with prominent, pretty raspberry and white chocolate notes, lingering delicately. 93 points rated by Wine Orbit.

Thomas Goss Merlot

Origin: McLaren Vale, Australia

Smooth and appealing, with a slight candied edge to the bright, juicy red berry flavours, cedar and spice notes. 92 points rated by Wine Orbit.

Penny's Hill Crackling Black Shiraz

Origin: McLaren Vale, Australia

Satsuma plum and red berry fruits layered with anise, mocha and dark chocolate. Generous red berry and plum fruits persist, balanced by subtle oak and sweet spice. This well-structured wine is supported by fine long tannins and exceptional fruit weight, making it unmistakably McLaren Vale, more so Penny's Hill. 93 points rated by James Halliday.

François Millet Sancerre Rouge

Origin: Loire Valley, France

100% Pinot Noir. Pure and very fresh, with a fine chalky spine that lets cherry, damson plum and violet notes stream through with abandon. Offers a long, unadorned finish. 90 points rated by Wine Spectator.

Cristia Cote du Rhone Rouge

Origin: Rhone Valley, France

100% Grenache. Is medium-bodied and juicy, with plenty of Bing cherry, blueberry and strawberry aromas and flavours.

Penny's Hill Edwards Road Cabernet Sauvignon

Origin: McLaren Vale, Australia

A complex varietal nose of blackberry, mulberry and red currant fruit with hints of tobacco and earthiness. A wine showing great generosity, the palate is abundant with varietal Cabernet Sauvignon characters; black fruits and savoury notes are perfectly balanced with fine long tannins, exceptional fruit weight and a length to charm. 94 points rated by James Halliday.

Head High Sonoma County Pinot Noir

Origin: Sonoma County, California

This is beautifully balanced, starts with bold, ripe fruit before settling into a smooth and stylish wine. 91 points rated by Tasting Panel.

Chateau Teyssier St. Emilion Grand Cru

Origin: Bordeaux, France

Blend of Merlot & Cabernet Franc. The wine exhibits a dense ruby/purple colour and soft berry fruit, with hints of cedar, vanilla and foresty, earthy notes. This wine displays outstanding fruit, impressive purity, and a nicely textured mouthfeel. Always made in an up-front and satisfying style. 88 points rated by Wine Enthusiast.

Paul Lato Matinee Pinot Noir

Origin: Santa Barbara, California

This unfiltered cuvee reveals elegant strawberry, raspberry and pomegranate notes, fresh acids, medium body, admirable purity and an impressive texture as well as finish.

Thomas Goss Sauvignon Blanc Origin: Adelaide Hills, Australia

This fresh and beautifully balanced Sauvignon Blanc displays lifted tropical and citrus fruits with hints of passionfruit sweetness on the mid palate and a crisp acid finish. 92 points rated by Wine Orbit.

François Millet Sancerre Blanc Origin: Loire Valley, France

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Lively, with a bold jolt of gooseberry leading the way, followed by lemon zest and thyme notes. Flinty zip on the finish. 88 points rated by Wine Enthusiast.

Head High Sonoma County Chardonnay Origin: Sonoma County, California

Mild-mannered flavours of apple and pear take on a tart intensity on the entry of this well-made wine, evolving to show good integration of oak. A finishing note of anise hangs on.

Black Chook Pinot Grigio Origin: Adelaide Hills, Australia

Lifted floral notes with nashi pear, crisp apple and sweet spice, the palate is loaded with flavour, texture and a delicious acid crunch. This is a delicate and flavoursome style of wine and is beautifully suited to any occasion. 91 points rated by Wine Orbit.

Kuhling Gillot Nierstein Riesling Kabinett
Origin: Rheinhessen, Germany

Sweet, fizzy & deliciously yummy! It expresses itself in yellow fruits and a supple creaminess. The saline backbone is wrapped loosely with a fruity ribbon, and despite the low alcohol the finish is both long and complete.

Van Volxem Wiltinger Riesling
Origin: Mosel, Saar, Germany

Just some moderate aroma remnants of spontaneous fermentation, but citrus fruits notes are given ample room to express themselves. These becomes more pronounced in the palate, where juice and zesty peel of grapefruits and oranges compete with a sound dose of salty minerality for central stage.

Paul Lato Matinee Chardonnay
Origin: Santa Barbara, California

It displays wonderful notes of sweet white currants, crushed rocks, pineapples and acacia flowers. Medium to full-bodied with beautifully integrated wood, a striking minerality, a honeyed richness and superb purity, texture and length.
