

Red Wines

Corryton Burge Country Shiraz

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

A rich, soft, subtle and yet accomplished Shiraz with great depth and character. It has plenty of sweet black berry fruits on the nose and a savoury character with hints of black pepper and oak on the palate.

Thomas Goss Cabernet Sauvignon

Origin: McLaren Vale, Australia

Lively and open in texture, with prominent, pretty raspberry and white chocolate notes, lingering delicately.

Monte del Fra Ripasso Valpolicella Classico Superior DOC

Origin: Veneto, Italy

80% Corvina, 20% Rondinella. Ripe dark berry, vanilla and baking spice emerge from the glass. On the concentrated palate, smooth tannins accompany dried black cherry, white pepper and nutmeg. 92 points rated by James Suckling.

Corryton Burge Kith Barossa Grenache

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

Perfumed and fragrant with jasmine-fringed plum and blueberry characters supported by ginger spice, red liquorice, cola and softly spoken oak. Spacious and pretty in the mouth too, with billowy tannins and a gentle tide of ripe plum and spice on the finish.

Clos des Menuts St. Emilion Grand Cru

Origin: Bordeaux, France

A touch of Cabernet Franc in this wine has brought out perfumes that contrast with the indulgent Merlot. The wine has weight, concentration and structure. 91 points rated by Wine Enthusiast (2016).

Melville Estate Pinot Noir

Origin: Santa Barbara California, USA

Gorgeous nose of peppery red and black cherry fruits as well as spring flowers, spices, and subtle briny, marine-like nuances. It hits the palate with medium-bodied richness, an elegant, lively mouthfeel, supple tannins, and perfectly integrated acidity. 95 points rated by Wine Enthusiast.

**Monte Del Fra Amarone della Valpolicella Classico Lena di Mezzo
DOCG**

Origin: Venice, Italy

80% Corvina, 20% Rondinella. Tenuta Lena di Mezzo delivers juicy, thick aromas of sweet fruit and spicy black pepper and clove. It's a smooth, supple wine. 94 points rated by Falstaff.

Chateau Cantermerle Haut Medoc 5th Growth

Origin: Bordeaux, France

Château Cantemerle's wine is full of charm, developing flavours of black cherry and blackberry. Its tannins are silky on the palate and linger well. Pleasant and elegant from the outset, the wine has a good aging potential. It expresses the fullness of its aromas and all its power and complexity after a decade. To the delight of wine enthusiasts, the wines eventually become more supple and velvety.

White Wines

Corryton Burge Country Chardonnay

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

A delightful, subtly oaked South Australian Chardonnay that's lively and pleasingly rounded. If you have a soft spot for Aussie Chardonnay with just the right amount, but not too much, creamy oak then this is just the sort of thing you'll want to try.

Monte del Fra Pinot Grigio delle Venezie DOC

Origin: Venice, Italy

Intense floral notes of white flowers, acacia, and hawthorn. Fruity with good body, savory and elegant.

Head High Sonoma County Chardonnay

Origin: Sonoma County California, USA

Mild-mannered flavours of apple and pear take on a tart intensity on the entry of this well-made wine, evolving to show good integration of oak. A finishing note of anise hangs on.

Gerard Millet Sancerre Blanc

Origin: Loire Valley, France

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Vibrant Sauvignon notes of grapefruit and lemon with good weight and a clean crisp finish. Sancerre is the epitome of crisp, steely Sauvignon, and this fine example is so clean, pure and aromatic.

Monte del Fra Bonomo Sexaginta Custoza DOC

Origin: Veneto, Italy

The wine has an intense golden yellow colour. In the nose, you will smell bay leaf, ripe yellow fruits, citrus fruits, white flowers, dried apricots and honey. On the palate, the wine is dry, spicy, elegant, flattering and long-lasting.

93 points rated by James Suckling.

Gerard Millet Sancerre *Chêne* Marchand

Origin: Loire Valley, France

*100% Sauvignon Blanc. From one of the top vineyard sites in Sancerre, the steep south-facing *Chêne* Marchand vineyard provides fruit for this very concentrated and impressive wine. Its weight doesn't come from richness, but rather a powerful structure that underpins a mineral tang and intense freshness.*

Champagne

Charles Heidsieck Blanc de Blancs

Origin: Champagne, France

The Blanc de Blancs Charles Heidsieck elevates the grandeur of Chardonnay wines and is composed of 25% reserve wines, which combine in perfect harmony with the younger wines of the same year. The complex aromatic bouquet reveals fragrances of ripe fruit and candied citrus fruits, as well as subtle fragrances of white flower and fresh hazelnuts.

The palate is fresh, velvety and has persistent finish with a delicious minerality.

Wagner Stempel Heerkertz Riesling Kabinett

Origin: Rhein Hessen, Germany

From the grand cru terrior Heekertz site. The cool mint and parsley aromas are married to super-bright apple and tart, peachy notes. Very sleek and energetic with racy crispy acidity that has sorbet-like character. Pristine finish. From organically grown grapes.
