

Red Wines

Corryton Burge Country Cabernet Sauvignon

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

A velvety, robust and fruit driven Cabernet Sauvignon from South Australia's Barossa Valley. With a hatful of blackberry and cassis melded with a creaminess acquired from 12 months spent in French and American oak, this is the essence of a classic Barossa Cabernet. It has a fresh, bright palate and subtle texture giving the right framework to allow everything to hang together superbly well.

Corryton Burge Country Shiraz

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

A rich, soft and subtle South Australian Shiraz from the Barossa Valley. This is an accomplished Shiraz with great depth and character. Deep in colour, it has plenty of sweet black berry fruits on the nose and a savoury character with hints of black pepper and oak on the palate. The long aging in oak gives it a well-integrated structure, allowing the fruit to shine.

Château Cheval Brun Saint Emilion Grand Cru

Origin: Bordeaux, France

The wine has an elegant spicy aroma, which interweave shades of ripe red fruits, vanilla and enticing echoes undergrowth. Fat meaty taste of the wine wonderfully combines not only power, but also a certain grace, elegance and harmony, as well as soft tannins.

Corryton Burge Cornelian Bay Pinot Noir

Origin: Tasmania, Australia

This terrific Pinot Noir is sourced from Tasmania from a vineyard on the Derwent River. Beautifully seductive aromas of sour cherry and subtle truffle mushroom characters. High notes of red fruits are underpinned by deeper generous flavours, where a little strawberry and raspberry adds another dimension. Fine bony tannins and well managed oak complete a very good wine.

Chateau Cantermerle Haut Medoc 5th Growth

Origin: Bordeaux, France

Château Cantemerle's wine is full of charm, developing flavours of black cherry and blackberry. Its tannins are silky on the palate and linger well. Pleasant and elegant from the outset, the wine has a good aging potential. It expresses the fullness of its aromas and all its power and complexity after a decade. To the delight of wine enthusiasts, the wines eventually become more supple and velvety.

Fratelli Seghesio La Villa Barolo DOCG

Origin: Piedmont, Italy

The Barolo la Villa strikes an engaging chord with a nose rich in baking spices, cracked pepper, and dried herbs, grounded by an undercurrent of forest floor and black-raspberry preserves. It fills the mouth with density, brimming with ripe red berries, yet remains lifted with tannins that are sweet and well-integrated, lending a structure that frames the fruit without diminishing its vibrancy.

Cristia Chateauneuf du Pape Rouge Vieille Vignes

Origin: Rhone Valley, France

This 100% Grenache wine delivers a lush, enticing blast of cassis and raspberry and boysenberry preserve flavours, carried by a silky structure that lets the fruit play out at length, giving adequate time for black tea, singed apple wood, dried anise and fruitcake notes to fill in throughout.

Paul Lato Solomon Hills Pinot Noir Suerte

Origin: Santa Barbara, California

Leading off the Pinot Noirs, the 2018 Suerte Solomon Hills Vineyard comes from a great vineyard just west of Bien Nacido and spent 17 months in 60% new French oak. Lots of black raspberries, spiced cherries, salty sea breeze, flowers, orange blossom, and violet notes emerge from the glass, and it's beautifully textured, full-bodied, and incredibly sexy on the palate.

Mas De Boislauzon Chateauneuf Du Pape Cuvee Du Quet

Origin: Rhone Valley, France

Made from as 80% Grenache and 20% Mourvèdre, the 2019 Châteauneuf Du Pape Cuvée Du Quet is another heavenly, monster of a wine from this estate that boasts a dense ruby/plum color as well as a kaleidoscopic array of red and black fruits, ground pepper, cured meats, and new saddle leather. Rich, full-bodied, and incredibly concentrated, it has a thrilling multi-dimensional texture, loads of tannins, and a heavenly finish..

Paul Lato Larner Syrah Cinematique

Origin: Santa Barbara, California

The 2014 Syrah Cinematique Larner Vineyard is a gorgeously complex Syrah that offers tons of sweet black cherries, framboise, incense and olive aromas and flavours. Full-bodied, impeccably balanced and insanely pure, this estate is one of the true gems in the Central Coast. This wine shines for its purity, finesse and elegance, just as much as for their texture and beautiful California fruit.

Crown Point Cabernet Sauvignon

Origin: Happy Canyon, California

The 2019 Cabernet Sauvignon, blended with 10% Cabernet Franc, is deep ruby in color, with ringing tones of violet complementing blueberry, black cherry and redcurrants, plus sparks of aniseed, prosciutto and desert herbs. The palate is plush and supple, offering alluring spicy accents and generous, yet never onerous, fruit. Refreshing bursts of acidity call you back to the glass, and it finishes with fantastic length. It blossoms considerably as it spends time in the glass, alluding to continued evolution in bottle.

Corryton Burge Country Chardonnay

Origin: Barossa Valley, Australia

A delightful, subtly oaked South Australian Chardonnay that's lively and pleasingly rounded. If you have a soft spot for Aussie Chardonnay with just the right amount, but not too much, creamy oak then this is just the sort of thing you'll want to try.

Monte del Fra Pinot Grigio delle Venezie DOC

Origin: Venice, Italy

Intense floral notes of white flowers, acacia, and hawthorn. Fruity with good body, savory and elegant.

Perriere Chablis

Origin: Burgundy, France

100% Chardonnay. An abundance of wild flowers embrace aromas of fresh lemon, lime and lemongrass. The palate is round with freshly cut pears, citrus peel, ginger spice, wet stones and salt. the finish is focused and layered with tones of complexity.

Gerard Millet Sancerre Blanc

Origin: Loire Valley, France

100% Sauvignon Blanc. Vibrant Sauvignon notes of grapefruit and lemon with good weight and a clean crisp finish. Sancerre is the epitome of crisp, steely Sauvignon, and this fine example is so clean, pure and aromatic.

Gunther Steinmetz Brauneberger Juffernuhr GB Riesling

Origin: Mosel, Germany

A classic example of high elegance that made this site a legend today. The considerable power and concentration are totally underplayed, the finesse enormous. Extremely delicate white flower and white peach aromas. Enormously long and precise finish that grows and grows as it gently dominates your palate and your mind. 97 points rated by Stuart Pigott.

Three Sticks Durell Chardonnay

Origin: Sonoma County, California

This is a tremendously bright expression from a famous site. It is exuberant in tangy lemon, crushed rock and sea spray, with lasting acidity that tapers it all. Offering a beautiful mix of texture and nuanced earthiness, this is a wholly memorable wine. 97 points by Wine Enthusiast.

Wagner Stempel Heerkretz Riesling Großes Gewäch

Origin: Rheinhessen, Germany

This incredible dry riesling presents an astonishing gracefulness. With aeration in the glass aromas of a wide spectrum of exotic fruits, curry leaves and Thai basil develop. In spite of this extravagance on the mid-palate, it is a prima ballerina standing en pointe. So pure and precise at the super-salty mineral finish you can't resist.

Paul Lato Kokoro Chardonnay

Origin: Santa Barbara, California

100% Chardonnay aged 16 months in 75% new French oak. Its golden hue is followed by a Meursault-like nose of ripe orchard and tangerine fruits, toasted hazelnuts, white flowers, and vanilla cream. With medium to full-bodied richness, it shows the more rounded, supple, forward style of the vintage, has nicely integrated acidity, and a great finish.

Champagne

Colin Alliance Brut NV

Origin: Champagne, France

65% Chardonnay and 35% Pinot Meunier grown in the Vertus Premier Cru and Sézanne vineyards. The aromatic profile fits between a plant-based floral world and a deliciously fruity world. The nose is bursting with notes of flowers, eucalyptus, apricot, wine peach, barley sugar, quince and candied fruit. This balanced champagne's velvet softness comes to life in the mouth. An easy-to-drink and delicious champagne oozing a sense of fulfilment and generosity.

Wagner Stempel Heerkertz Riesling Kabinett

Origin: Rhein Hessen, Germany

From the grand cru terrior Heerkertz site. The cool mint and parsley aromas are married to super-bright apple and tart, peachy notes. Very sleek and energetic with racy crispy acidity that has sorbet-like character. Pristine finish. From organically grown grapes.
